

STUDY ABROAD*

Courses taken through study abroad programs are courses taken at another institution. As such, all policies for courses taken at another institution apply.

A student in good standing who has completed the foundational courses may seek to study abroad during either the summer session or as part of a semester-long program. Students who wish to study abroad are encouraged to research ABA-approved programs. Prior to the application to a study abroad program, the student should submit a written request to the Associate Dean for Student Affairs to enroll in the specific courses offered through the program. The request should provide the name of the sponsoring law school; the name, location, and duration of the study abroad program; and the name, credit hours, and course description for each course requested to be taken through the study abroad program.

Many courses offered through study abroad programs will count towards a student's global distribution requirement.
